**Rebuilding Together Montgomery County awards RT Honors for Community Service**

On Tuesday, November 8, 2005, Rebuilding Together Montgomery County presented the “RT Honors Community Service Award” to TW Perry CEO, Ed Quinn Jr, and Councilmember Steve Silverman at the first annual RT Honors Reception. These leaders were recognized for their commitment to the welfare of low-income, elderly, and disabled members of their community.

For many years, Ed Quinn and the employees of TW Perry have been strong supporters of Rebuilding Together. They have provided discounted building materials to Rebuilding Together volunteer groups, advocated on the organization’s behalf to hundreds of their vendors and business contacts, and sponsored the annual TW Perry Golf Classic – Rebuilding Together’s largest fundraiser of the year.

Upon receiving this award, Mr. Quinn stated: “My involvement with Rebuilding Together goes hand-in-hand with my building supply business. Working with RT allows us to help all the homeowners of the county continue to live safely and independently in their homes, regardless of their income. It’s our way of “giving back” to the community that has made TW Perry successful.”

Rebuilding Together honored County Councilmember Steve Silverman for his results-oriented leadership and advocacy on behalf of Rebuilding Together and low-income homeowners.

Upon receiving this award Mr. Silverman stated: “Rebuilding Together is a wonderful example of what volunteers can do together to help their neighbors. By targeting low-income homeowners, who might otherwise have to forego the home repairs that insure warmth, safety, and security in their homes, RT has helped the sometimes “silent” members of our community who were living in dangerous situations age safely in place.”
